Because of the Resolution, Governor Dunmore dissolved the House of Burgesses on May 26, 1774, causing the members to pass another Resolution proposing the first Continental Congress and helping to birth the United States of America.

In Early 2005, a small group of members of the United States House of Representatives began meeting in Room 219 of the United States Capitol to pray for our nation. The gravity of this meeting was derived from the Humble sincerity of their belief that God could heal the United States of America.

SOON THEREAFTER, THESE MEMBERS FORMED THE CONGRESSIONAL PRAYER CAUCUS TO VIGILANTLY WATCH AND TO PROTECT THE RIGHT OF INDIVIDUALS IN AMERICA TO PRAY. THEIR VISION FOR THE CAUCUS INSPIRED THE FORMATION OF SIMILAR CAUCUSES AROUND THE NATION.

As this response continues, it becomes more and more evident how important prayer is to our nation. Accordingly, this day we respectfully and humbly issue this "Call to Prayer" for Virginia and invite Virginians everywhere to pray that God will continue to bless this country and the freedom for which it stands, and that He will continue to bless the Commonwealth of Virginia.
